Do you have a well or spring? What's in your water?

The Virginia Household Water Quality Program aims to improve the water quality and health of Virginians with wells, springs, and cisterns. We provide affordable well-water testing, help interpret water test results and provide information about how to address problems.

How does it work?

Participants must register to receive well water sample kit(s) and instructions how to collect water samples. Participants will collect samples on a designated day and time and drop off at an Extension Office collection point. Water is analyzed on the Virginia Tech campus for 14 parameters. Once analysis is complete, confidential results, an explanation of what they mean, and information about addressing any problems will be sent via mail or email. A live video or recorded video presentation will be available to help participants understand results.

Refunds may be possible, must be requested by March 11th, and will incur a \$5 processing fee if approved. Special reduced cost through sponsorship: Hampton Roads Sanitation District is providing sponsorship for this clinic, reducing the cost from \$70/sample to \$20/sample for the first 80 kits purchased. Once results are returned, participants will have an opportunity to learn about the Sustainable Water Initiative for Tomorrow (SWIFT) at their local extension office. This innovative water purification initiative is designed to ensure a sustainable source of groundwater while addressing environmental challenges such as Chesapeake Bay restoration, sea level rise and saltwater intrusion.
